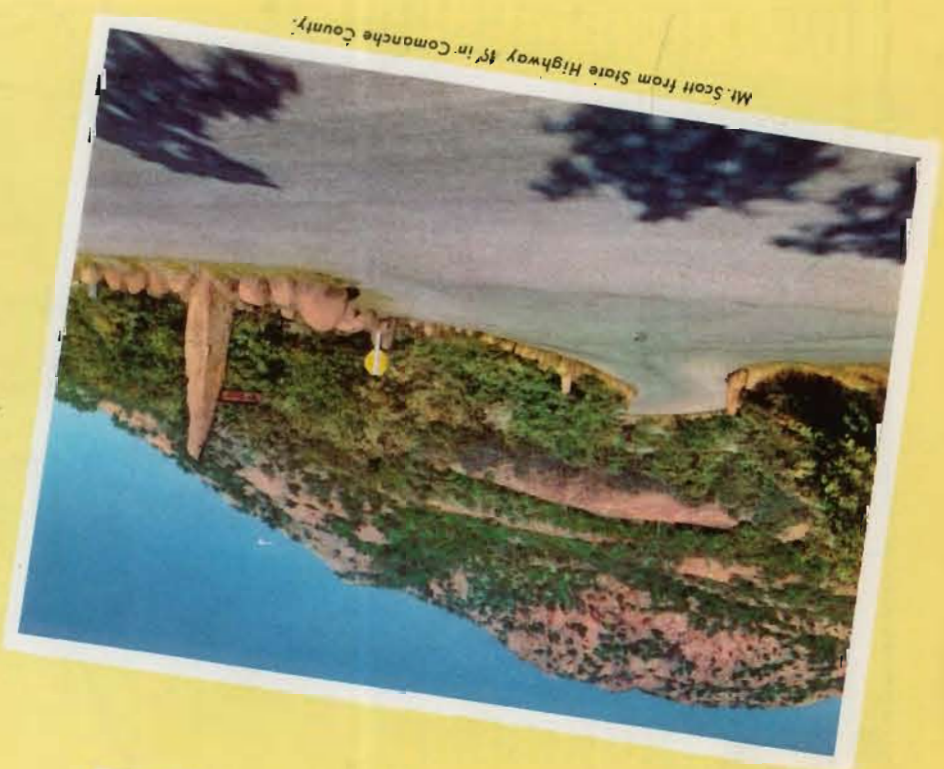


State Highway 23, Kingfisher Memorial Highway west of Kingfisher in Kingfisher County.

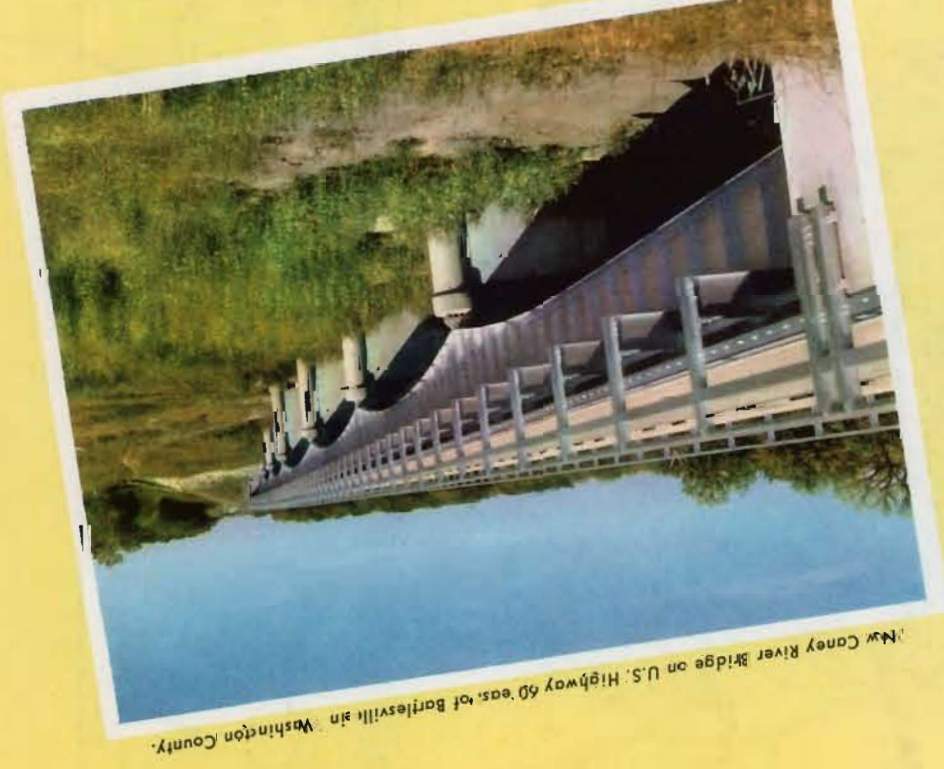
DRIVE SAFELY
SAFETY AND AN ACCIDENT
A FEW SECONDS IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN

HAVE your driver's or chauffeur's license in your immediate possession at all times when operating a motor vehicle. ALWAYS give your undivided attention. DRIVE also proper lane turning right or left. BE SURE road ahead is wide enough to allow safe passage before attempting to overtake and pass another vehicle. GIVE way to the right side of the road and do not increase speed when another vehicle operator signals by horn for right of way to overtake and pass. PARK off of traveled portion of highway and NEVER! part or stop on bridges. 91A? headlights when approaching an oncoming vehicle or following closely behind another.

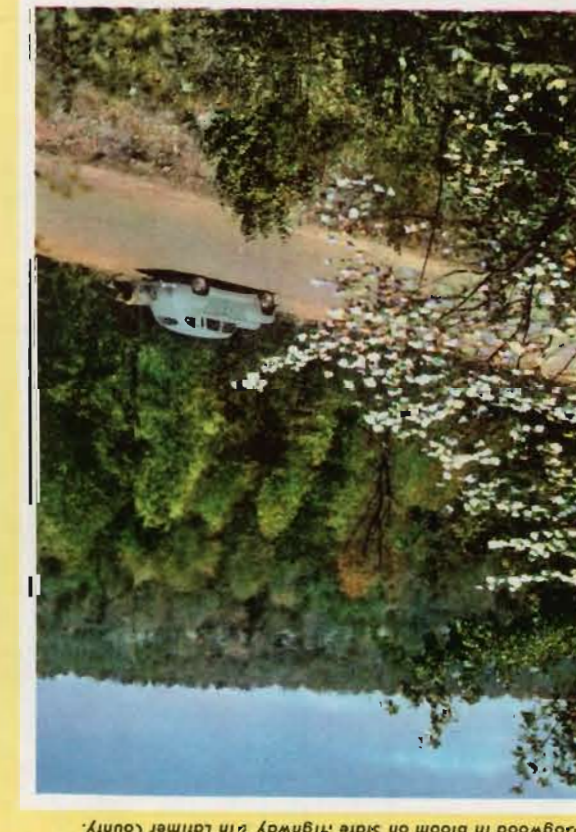

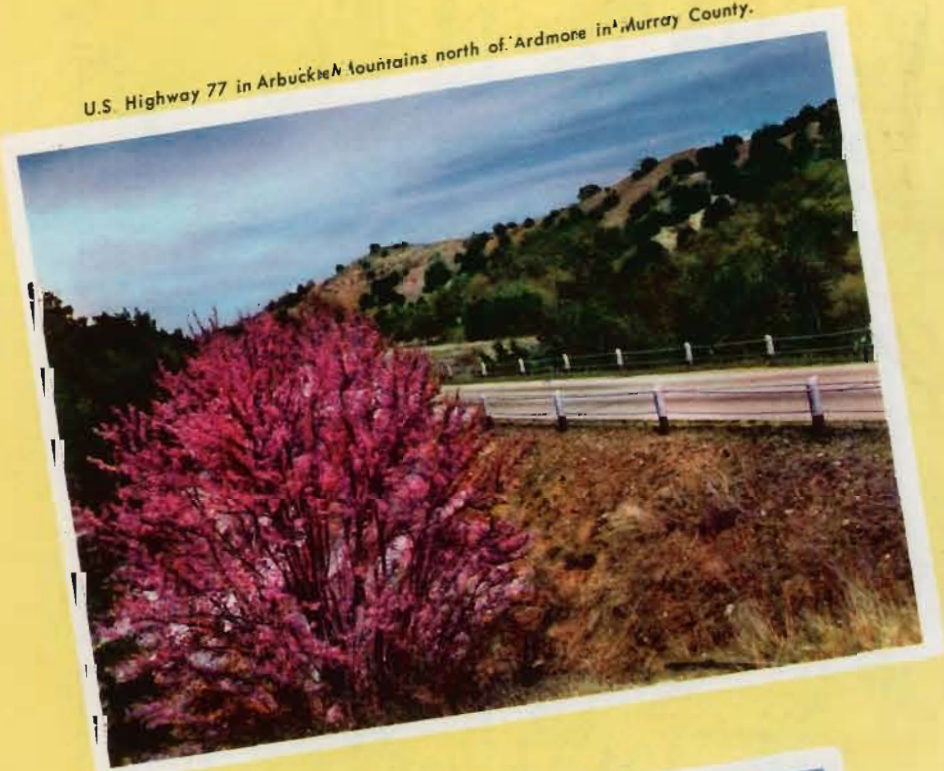

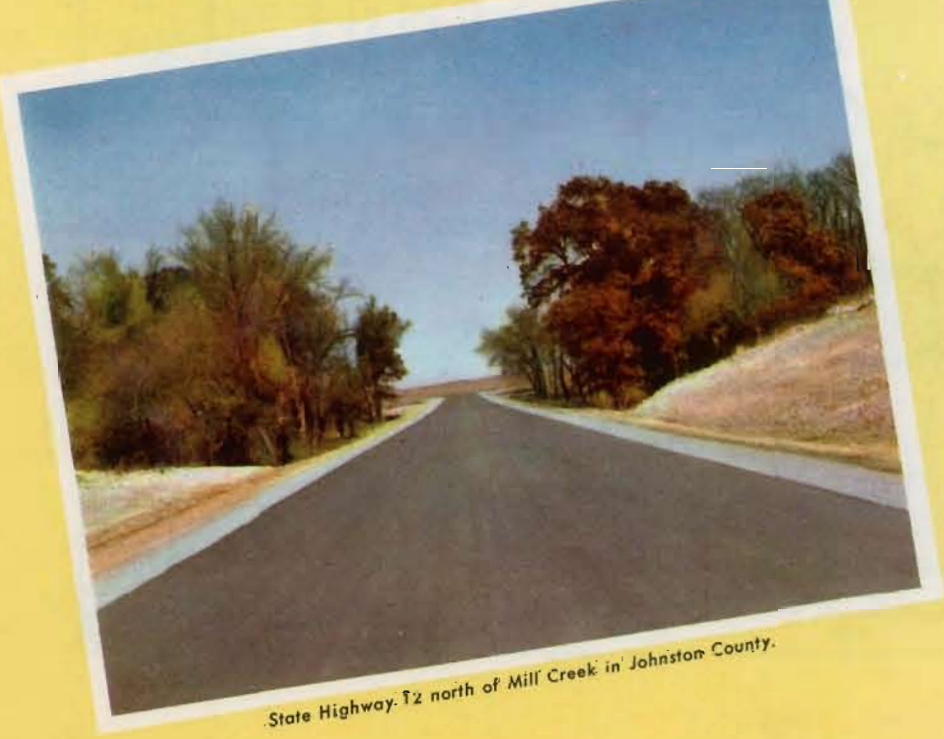
